





## Individual Attention



# Beyond the Classroom

**Technology Integration** - Classrooms at BIS come alive with discussions, debates, explorations and experiments, often woven together with technology. The use of teacher-developed subject websites and online tools have become commonplace in the BIS IBDP.

Inclusion and Pastoral Care- The lyrics of the BIS school song, written by students and composed by musician and ex-parent, Ranjit Barot, include the line, "This is our school, this is our home" which encapsulates the relationship between the school and its students. Emphasizing its commitment to student welfare, BIS recognizes the need for pastoral care for DP students. A specialized team, at the Student Resource Centre, is available in- house to address these needs. This team comprising a Special Educator and a Counsellor are qualified to help students with time management, learning support and strategies, life skills and emotional counselling.

# Experiential Learning

BIS expands students' minds using hands-on, collaborative and reflective learning experiences which help them to imbibe knowledge in ways that are inventive and memorable.

Art students learnt about **indigenous systems of art from a traditional weaver and his loom**. Business Management students examined investment and liquidity by playing 'Monopoly'. English students explored gender and social inequity by enacting street plays. Math students recreated roller coasters with plastic piping to understand differential calculus.

# Interdisciplinary Projects

Imagine an interdisciplinary class in Mathematics and English where Tolstoy explains calculus, and models of 'bridges' help clarify metaphors. Imagine another class where Economics and Business Management come together to study the sustainability of the Reliance Jio network; and History and Psychology classes merged to explore the psychology behind conformity and how this played out in Nazi Germany. This kind of **cross fertilization is an inherent part of the process of student engagement.** 




